REGISTRATION: AUGUST 10^{TH} - 14^{TH}

- Registration will be held in person during the week of Monday, August 10- Friday, August 14.
- During registration you will be able to:
 - Turn in enrollment forms.
 - Pick up your temporary student ID.
 - Pick up your class schedule.
 - Drop off your old textbooks.
 - Pick up your new textbooks.

REGISTRATION, CONT. **REGISTRATION GUIDELINES:**

 - Line up, 6 feet apart as you enter the quad.
 - We request that students come alone or with one parent/guardian only.

Registration Day Procedures

- Station I: Turn in completed registration paperwork received in the mail during summer. If you did not receive a packet in the mail, blank copies will be provided. Please bring a pen (blue and black ink only).
 - Out-of-District students only: If we are missing any enrollment paperwork, including transcripts, birth certificate and immunization records, please bring to the Magnet Office or Attendance Office.
- Station 2: Pick up student Temporary ID and Class Schedule. Students attending Registration will have the opportunity to complete a class change request on this day ONLY, by completing a Google Form.
 - Class schedule changes are NOT guaranteed. Counselors will make an effort to grant requests, but classes may be full.
 - Students signed AP class commitments in the Spring therefore changing from AP to Honors or Honors to AP may not be available due to class size capacities.
 - If a summer course was completed, please bring your grade verification and complete the Google form to request class change.
 - Class change forms will ONLY be available during your specific grade level registration date.
- Station 3: Return last semester's textbooks. Please bring all old textbooks, novels, and library books to textbook drop off.
- Station 4: Pick up Fall Semester textbooks. Please make sure your student brings a backpack to carry new textbooks.
- > Technology Station (if applicable): Pick up requested Chromebook and/or Hotspot.

SMART START

- While we are beginning the school year in distance/remote learning, the District remains committed to offering a hybrid (partially on-site/partially remote) model of instruction, as soon as public health officials deem it safe. Once we do begin offering a hybrid model, families will still have the option of choosing to remain in a remote learning model.
- A combination of synchronous (with the teacher) and asynchronous (independent) instruction.
- <u>The first day of school for students is Tuesday, August 18th</u>. While the first day of instruction following the standard teacher schedule will be the 20th, there will be instructional content and interaction on the 18th and 19th for students and families. It is crucial that students participate starting August 18th!!
- Teachers will be using the first week to ensure students understand how to use the digital tools in each class to ensure success.

ATTENDANCE & GRADING

- Attendance will be taken daily. Students are expected to participate in learning (asynchronous or synchronous) during school hours. Parents will receive an attendance message if a student was marked absence the previous day.
 - Acceptable methods for parents/guardians to communicate an absence reason are:
 - Providing a written notice, signed and dated by parent/guardians;
 - An email initiated by a parent/guardian from the parent/guardian's known email address;
 - Upload of absence note in Parent Portal (job aid forthcoming)
 - A phone call to/from the known parent/guardian.
- Letter grades of A F can be earned. Please refer to the teacher's syllabus for how a student's grade will be earned.

Assessments

- Due to current County and State health and safety orders, the District is not engaging in in-person services to students at this time.
- Assessments require the use of in-person protocols in order to be valid and reliable based upon their norming standards. Due to these requirements, assessments cannot be conducted at this time.


